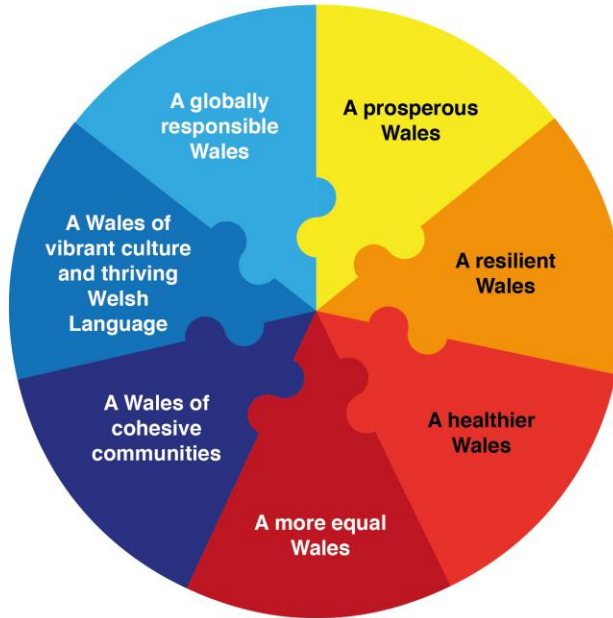

A Prosperous Wales

- Improve access, safety & stimulate the economy along the Heads of the Valleys
- 281 new employment opportunities
- 76% of all employees are from south Wales
- 80% of spend committed to Welsh suppliers
 - 53% of spend with local SMEs
- Development of local and sustainable supply chain
- Encouraging the use and links to public transport



A Resilient Wales

- Improving flood defence capability & water quality
- Local National Nature Reserve beech seedlings translocation
- 36 acres of new deciduous woodlands, benefiting:
 - National tourism and user inclusion
 - Enriching biodiversity
 - Cleaner air
 - Improved surface water run-off
- Providing support and continuous improvement to communities through BiTC BERG in times of need

A Healthier Wales

- Biodiversity enhancements and user inclusion
- Increased circular walking routes
- The new non-motorised user bridges encouraging walking/cycling & horse riding particularly for younger generations
- Improvement of air quality
- Reduction in nuisance noise levels
- Dedicated site based Occupational Health Nurse
- Proactive health initiatives for workforce

A More Equal Wales

- Dedicated training centre with National Skills Academy accreditation
- 'Construction Taster Programmes' and Prince's Trust 'Get into Construction Programme'
- 10 Graduate opportunities
- 69 Apprenticeship and employment opportunities
- 250 work experience & summer placements
- Over 18,000 hours of training delivered
- Working with schools to engage over 7,000 learners
- Professional skills development in schools targeting under represented groups

- New footbridges increasing community cohesion
- Sensitive exhumation and reburial in conjunction with the Methodist Church in Wales
- Visitor Centre & Exhibitions
- Project presentations and site visits by around 6,500 members of the public
- Effective & innovative digital communications
- Circa £150,000 raised for local charities
- £400,000 memorial gardens & wheelchair racetrack at Ty Hafan
- Legacy projects
- Local sponsorship and promotion of local events

A Wales of Vibrant Culture and Thriving Welsh Language

- Bilingual documentation and fluent Welsh speakers
- Support for local events strategically selected to promote Welsh language and culture
- New iconic structure named after a local WW1 war hero
- Design of scheme inspired by industrial heritage and local geology
- Cultural Heritage reports shared with the local groups
